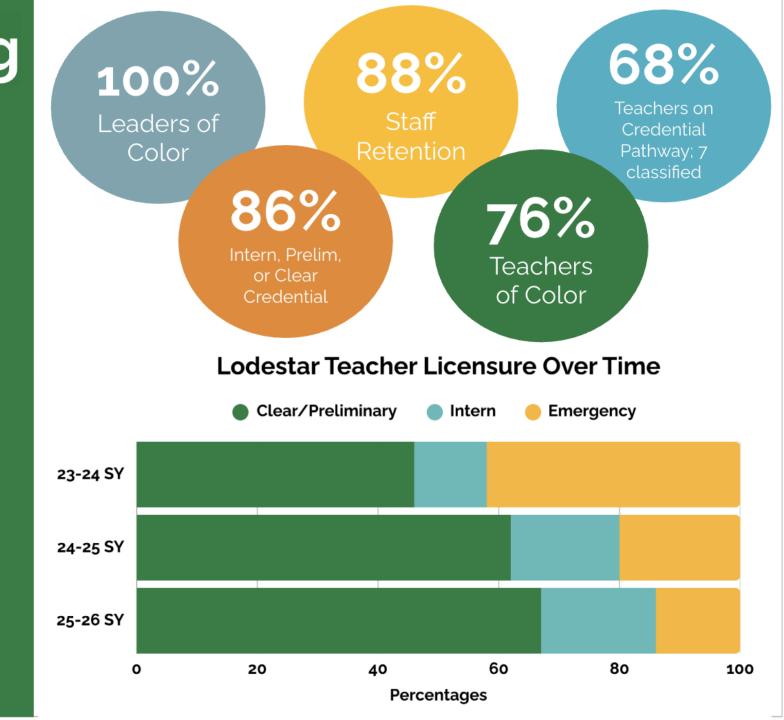

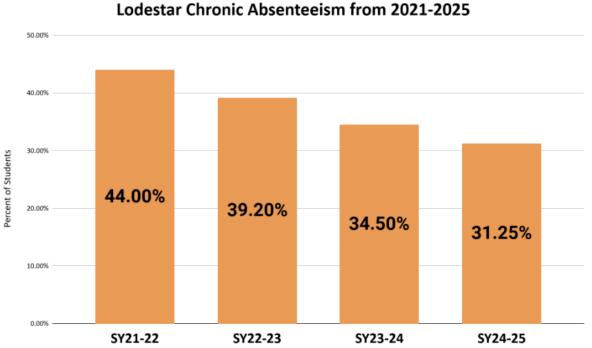

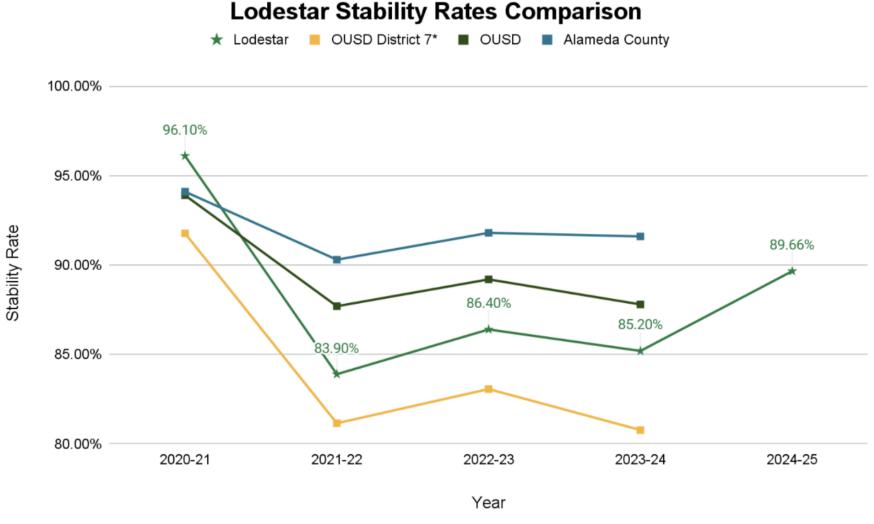
Lodestar's Stability Rate Findings:

Immigration Policy. Protecting our students, families, and community.

LCPS Resolution and Policy: Commitment to the Education of All Immigrant Children

- First adopted in 2016; updated in response to current Administration in February 2025
- Ensures the confidentiality of student and family information
- Prohibits staff from acting on immigration enforcement requests
- Sets clear standards for all staff and broader community on inclusive practices and protections

- 1:1 Legal supports and workshops for families





Teachers, administrators caught in crosshairs of immigration crackdown



Case in point: "Public schools are designed to serve all kids — full stop," said Rich Harrison, the CEO of Lighthouse Community Public Schools, which serves around 1,600 students in East Oakland, California.

 A 2015 study <u>estimated</u> that undocumented immigrants made up 17% of East Oakland residents, and an estimated 35% of children in the area have "at least one unauthorized parent."

Lighthouse provided its families with toolkits in English and Spanish that advise on family preparedness plans, highlight legal resources and outline relevant legislation, and the schools have assured parents of its policies that affirm the right to education for all.

 "We're in a day and age where misinformation travels just as fast as the correct information, which really makes for supporting young people and their families incredibly challenging," Harrison said.

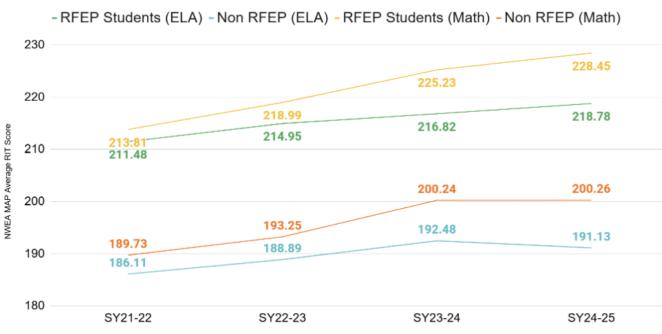

Lodestar MAP NWEA Reclassified Students Compared to Non RFEP





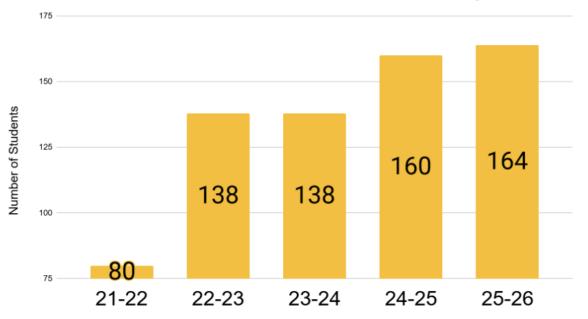

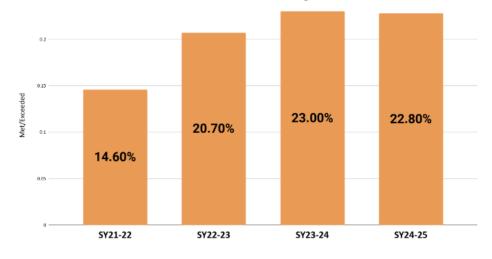

Audit Finding Transparency.

Investing in safe and equitable spaces in our East Oakland community



Context of our Capital Expenses:

- First and foremost, LCPS had an <u>Unmodified Audit</u>
 Opinion for the 2024-25 fiscal year.
- Bonds secured through the California School Finance Authority (CSFA) for the Lodestar campus, which included~\$3M for capital expenses in 2022.
- Projects over a 2 year period (2023-2024): additional Elementary and Middle school classroom spaces, as well as a turf athletics / PE field.
- In the pre-audit process, a material weakness in internal controls under "property, plant and equipment" was identified as this was the first time reconciling our capital expenditures and bonds.
- This issue was corrected for our unaudited actuals and final audit, and LCPS also addressed the internal controls issue related to this finding.
