1. Music Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

During the 24/25 school year, our school was in the entry phase of our music program. We are now equipped with many instruments that are stored here on campus, and students are allowed to check-out the instruments during the after school program, but we would like to ensure that our music club is staffed, and students are provided with additional materials to continue to expand their interest.

\$4,500	Clubs/ Supplies A goal of Measure G1 is to increase middle school access to the arts, music and world language, and at LWP, we intend to expand the number of student clubs which will celebrate the various interests and identities of our students. Staff and students have expressed an interest in increasing clubs options (ie. sign language, music, debate etc). We want to ensure access to resources as clubs initiate, and our team is currently coordinating with after school to expand clubs for our robust program that serves 103 of our 170 middle school students. Funds will be divided amongst the various clubs equitably and will support	We hope to build students' sense of belonging and increase student attendance to school. If students are given the tools and resources to start clubs of interest, they will feel connected to our communities and be able to develop a sense of identity and leadership. An anticipated outcome is a 7% increase in overall sense of belonging within our middle school students. We will use Panorama Survey data to monitor student experience as well as attendance to school, programs, events, and clubs. From our Fall survey, students' overall sense of belonging rating stood at 46%. Although this is an increase of 3% from the previous year, we would like to see exponential growth in this area.

2. Art Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

LWP offers art courses to middle school students during their elective periods. During this time, students engage in projects and learn the skills needed to master particular techniques used in class. Art and general education teachers have also collaborated during our end of semester exhibitions to ensure there is an art

component to their summative assessments and projects that is related to the unit's topic. In last year's submission, we did note that our current art program was quality in the aspect of staffing, facilities, access, and professional learning, but also acknowledged that our equipment and materials could use improvement.

\$1,000	Art Supplies At LWP, we have an Art elective that our 6-8th grade students participate in. During this course, students are exposed to various forms of art and expression and collaborate on projects within the classroom space. Items created in their art class are used to beautify our school, and we want to be sure to provide materials to continue to have the resources and materials to showcase our students artistic expression Students have recently expressed wanting to repaint our murals and a desire to develop strategic changes that meet the goals of the measure and that will lead to improved student outcomes.	

3. World Language Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

Currently, we are only able to offer high school students foreign language due to staffing/master calendaring constraints. Although we offer P.E, Art and ELD for middle school electives, we would like to expand our language offerings to the middle school as well. There have been some offerings around language instruction, and we are hoping to implement these opportunities during the after school program, and want to compensate staff. We are also hoping to hire 2 full time staff members for middle school (6th grade), and are hoping to use additional funds for hiring bonuses.

\$8,000	Staffing & retention After reviewing feedback and data from teachers, staff and families, it is clear that we need to focus on staff retention and hiring. LWP currently has 2 long term subs within the ELD (6-8) and Math/Science (6th Grade). We want to ensure that we can attract qualified staff. We want to be able to offer a hiring bonus and/or funds to compensate teachers for taking on additional responsibilities such as teaching a language course in middle school.	When we are fully staffed with qualified, credentialed teachers, students are able to build on their learning within the classroom space. Staff members hired through our network will be committed to our school's mission and vision and will receive coaching and training around classroom instruction and progress monitoring to ensure student growth. We will use our hiring tracker, attendance data, and grades to monitor progress.

4. 5th to 6th Grade Enrollment Retention

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

[As we concluded the school year, our goal for 6th grade enrollment was 68 students, and we currently have a class of 67 6th grade students (had 68 at the beginning of year). We were also able to retain our previous cohort of 6th grade students (7th grade enrollment 59). We want to focus on building students' sense of belonging here at school to retain our students each year.

\$4,125.42	Attendance Incentives (Monthly perfect attendance raffles) LWP's attendance rate is currently at 93%, and we want to be sure to maintain our goal of 94% for the year. During the 2425 school year, we offered attendance incentives, and are continuing with that practice this year as well. We have held ice cream socials for the grade levels with the highest attendance for the month and given prizes for our perfect attendance raffles. For the perfect Attendance raffles, prizes included flat screen TVs, Headphones, and much more; we would like to continue to offer the prizes to reward students and their families as we work towards our attendance goal.	

5. Safe and Positive School Culture

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

At LWP, we use ClassDojo as our PBIS and students can use those points collected at our student store that is run by our student government. As we step into this school year, our current panorama data shows that students' sense of belonging is at 46% and student safety is at 52%, and we want to ensure that we are increasing both of those data points. Expanding our PBIS offerings is one way to ensure shifts to positive and safe behaviors.

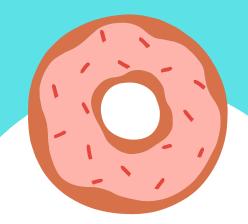

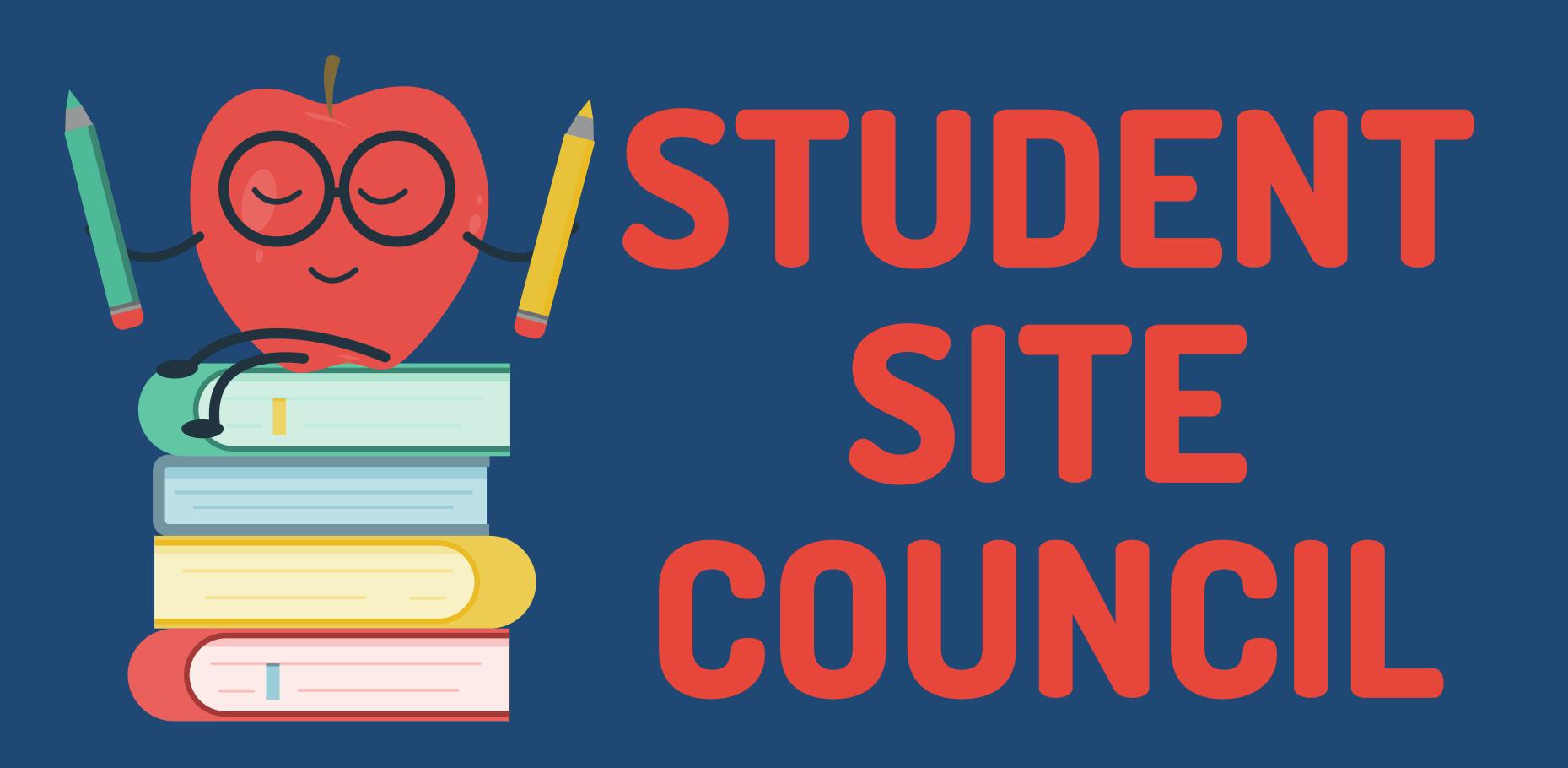
