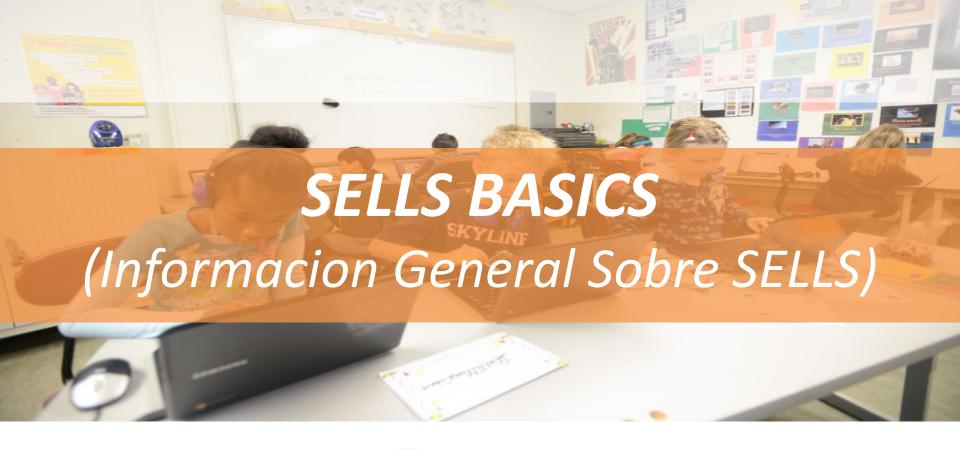

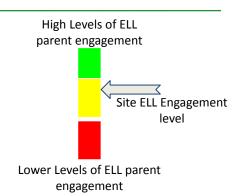

## Safety Plan

Goal I: During the 2026-27 school year we will decrease the amount of referrals by 10%, as measured by information in AERIES and collected by the OUSD Data Dashboard.

- Training on conflict resolution. In the 25/26 school year, the focus has been on community building and SEL implementation. The next Strategy 1.1: step is more alignment and training for when behaviors escalate, either in the classroom or on the yard. We also partnered with outside organizations to support teachers with mindfulness practices inside the classroom, as well as providing teachers with SEL and communication strategies for their students. Parents receive communication about incidents that occur, even if it isn't an official referral. Students are also held accountable for their behavior by engaging in restorative practices.
- Analyze Referral and Suspension data in the Leadership team to analyze the root cause and how to support the student, teacher and Strategy 1.2: systems to reduce referrals and suspensions. Analyze areas of the school / times of the day that are hot spots for safety issues and plan with staff and families on solutions. Through the OUSD Oakland Healthy Kids curriculum and Sown to Grow, we will address community building and confict resolution. We will also implement curriculum around drug usage and prevention in classes.
