Ratification by the Board of Education of the President of the Board's appointment of Andrew Nelsen, as a Community Member at Large, to the Measures B, J, and Y Independent Citizens School Facilities Bond Oversight Committee, effective November 13, 2025, for the unexpired term ending June 30, 2027.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The duties of the Measures B.J.Y Committee, as defined by Board Bylaw 9131, among other duties, is to provide advice and recommendation to the District regarding the expenditure of funds for bond related projects, to actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction and to take any necessary action in furtherance of its purpose including, but not limited to, receiving and reviewing copies of annual independent financial audits and deferred maintenance proposals, inspecting school facilities and grounds, receiving and reviewing cost-saving measures designed to reduce the costs of professional fees and site preparation. The Committee also shall have the option to tour sites where Bond funds are being expended, with support from the Superintendent.

<u>Campaign to Stop the Sex Trade:</u> Created a resident- based Organizing Committee of 100 multi-racial, multi-lingual neighborhood leaders who were concerned about street-level sex trafficking in the San Antonio neighborhood. Their advocacy led to the development of an OUSD program to address the issue in schools, the creation of Oakland's Dear John demand-reduction campaign, and the successful closure of a problem motel.

<u>East 14th Street Congress of Neighborhoods:</u> Founded a collaborative of community organizing groups in East Oakland. The Congress is building a lasting network of active, informed residents, organized across race, language and neighborhoods, to identify and advocate for their own collective interests, in the context of rapid gentrification and displacement.
