5. Safe and Positive School Culture

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

I began in the principal role in January, my self-assessment reflects a partial year of implementation paired with a review of existing practices and community feedback. It became clear that middle school students needed more consistent behavioral, SEL, restorative, and attendance support than current capacity allowed. While previous G1 funds supported the School Support Manager role, the level of student need exceeded the staffing allocation.

A key learning from last year's implementation is that targeted case management, SEL support, and strong family partnership reduce repeat behavioral incidents and increase student engagement when implemented consistently. Families also expressed a need for clearer communication and more proactive support as students navigate middle school.

These learnings shaped this year's proposal to use carryover funds to expand the SSM's capacity. This adjustment directly addresses identified student needs and aligns with Measure G1 goals for fostering a safe, positive, and supportive middle school environment.

\$10,699.82	The School Support Manager serves as a case manager supporting students needing more services such as check in/check out systems, family partnerships, attendance support, Mental Health connections, and behavioral and restorative supports.	Behavioral Growth: Students receiving case management will show a reduction in repeated behavioral incidents by at least 20 percent, as tracked by behavior and suspension data. Restorative & SEL Improvement: Students in check-in/check-out or restorative support cycles will demonstrate improved indicators of self-regulation and school connectedness, measured by point sheets, teacher feedback, or progress monitoring tools. Family Engagement: At least 25 families of case-managed students will participate in ongoing partnership meetings, leading to clearer support plans and improved home-school communication.

1. Welcome

Ms. Rayl opened the meeting,, and set the purpose of Principal Chats as a space for transparency and partnership.

2. Overview of Measure G1 Funding

Families received an explanation of the purpose of Measure G1 and how funds specifically support school programming. Families confirmed understanding.

3. Review of Carryover Amount

The total carryover amount was shared along with required uses. Families asked clarifying questions about why the carryover exists and how funds can be spent.

4. School Needs Assessment

Attendance and behavior data were reviewed. Families emphasized wanting stronger support for transitions into middle school and consistency in expectations and responses to behavior.

5. SSM Overview

The SSM role was thoroughly explained. Families expressed appreciation for increased case management and restorative support for students.

6. Family Input

Families suggested more communication regarding interventions and student progress. There was strong support for using carryover funds to increase SSM capacity.

The principal explained how input would inform the proposal and what would be presented in October.

1. Welcome and Reflections

Families reflected on the themes from the September meeting. Behavior consistency and attendance remained top priorities.

2. Carryover Updates

Families were reminded that G1 funds must support middle school students

3. School Culture

Behavior trends from quarter one were reviewed. Families voiced the need for consistent expectations and timely follow-up for incidents. Parents supported increased mental health access.

4. SSM Impact

The SSM shared story examples of students making progress through check-in/check-out, restorative chats, and attendance follow-up. Families asked for clear updates when their child is receiving support.

5. Family Feedback Session

Families agreed that funding the SSM role was appropriate for the needs of middle school students. Additional ideas included more family workshops and clearer communication about behavior expectations. Families shared concerns around long term subs and teacher retention and more support for admin conjuring admin structure is different this year.

6. Next Steps

Ms. Ray explained that the final carryover recommendation would be brought to the November meeting for approval. As well as follow up on interviewing more prospective candidates once the pool is updated.
