1. Music Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

The EBIA Musical has become a cornerstone of our school culture, bringing our entire community together through creativity, teamwork, and shared pride. In reflecting on our previous year's use of G1 funds, we saw how this investment directly enhanced student engagement and learning. The funds allowed us to expand student participation beyond acting roles—empowering students to take ownership of costumes, stage design, lighting, sound engineering, and overall production management. This hands-on experience built technical and leadership skills that extend beyond the stage.

From last year's experience, we learned the importance of early planning and targeted budgeting to maximize student involvement and ensure quality production resources. This year, we are applying those learnings by allocating G1 funds more strategically—prioritizing durable materials for sets and costumes, improving our sound system for long-term use, and offering student-led workshops to build skills in stagecraft and production technology. Through this intentional approach, the EBIA Musical continues to be not only a showcase of talent but also a meaningful, collaborative learning experience for all students.

In partnership with Forest & Tree, 63 seventh-grade students will participate in a day of rock climbing and cooperative problem solving at Oaktown Boulders in Oakland. Through bouldering challenges and a "challenge by choice" model, students will build trust, perseverance, and leadership in a supportive environment. By connecting this experience to student effort and attendance, we aim to reinforce consistent school engagement and foster a stronger sense of belonging.
