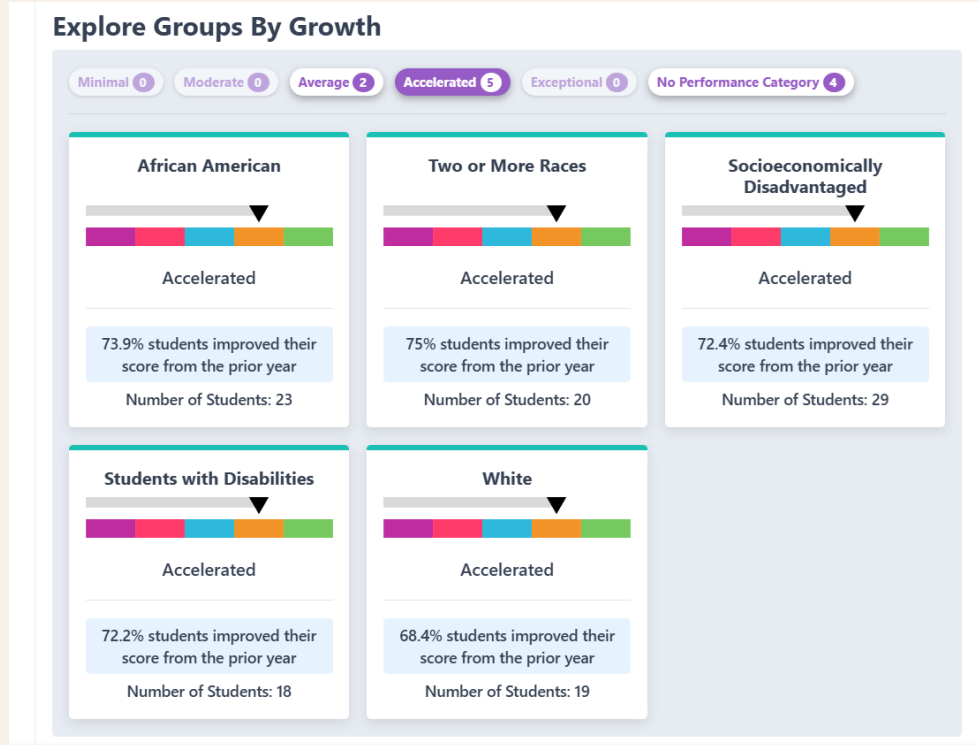

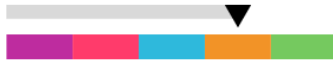

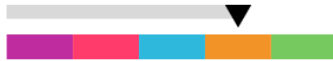

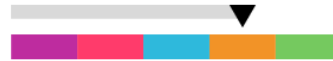

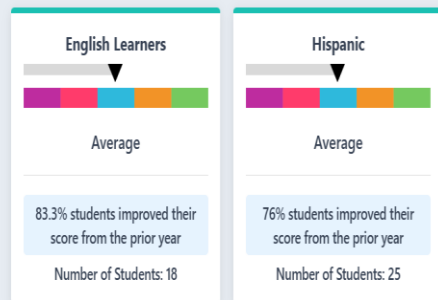

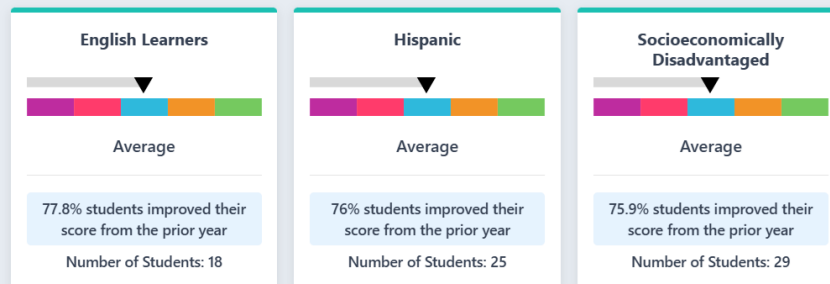

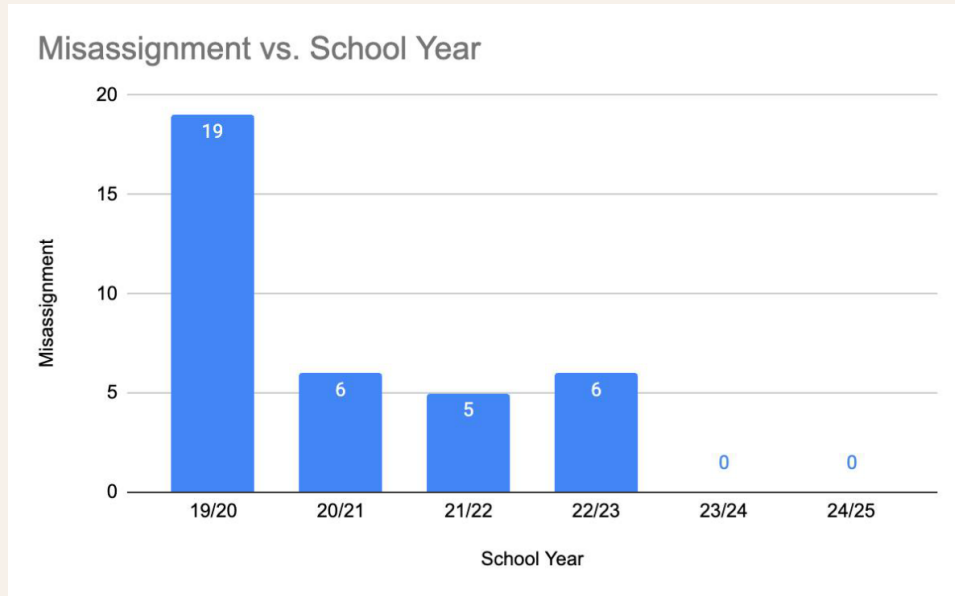

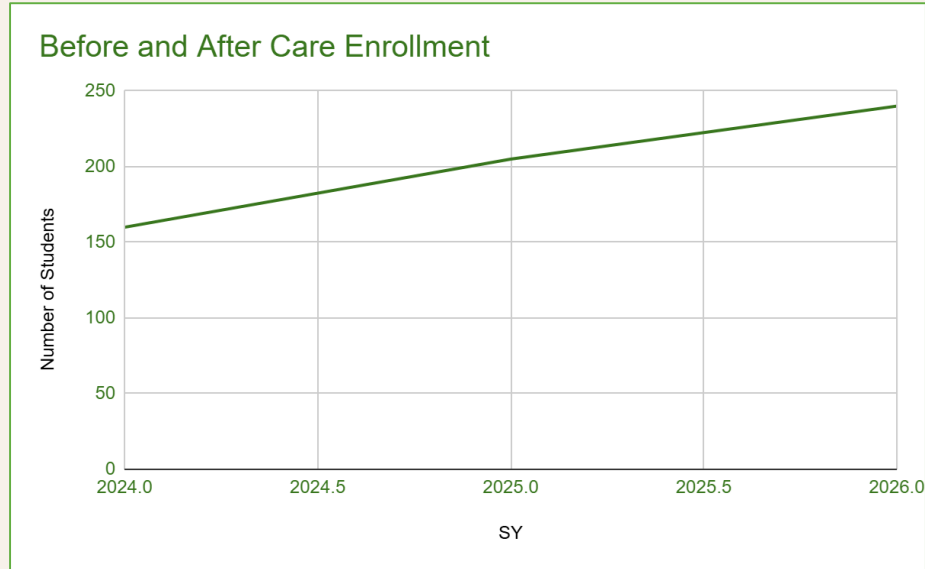
Equitable Access and Enrollment

- Priority enrollment in our free Summer and After-school programs.

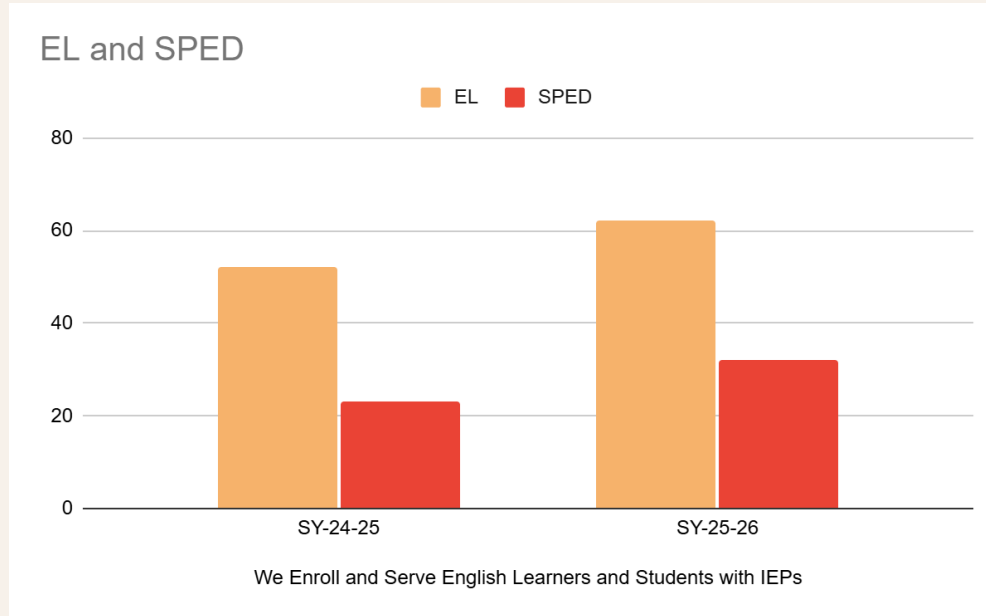
Commitment to Continue Growing and Developing Practices to Support Our Most Vulnerable Students

- Set up enrollment tables at the Head Start center and community organizations
- Set up an enrollment table at WIC offices, family shelters, or public health clinics
- Create a “No-questions-Asked” closet in the new campus for *hygiene kits and pantry items*
- Build staff capacity for support: Trauma Informed Instruction, Restorative Practices, Family Workshops

We Serve 240 families in the Before and After Care Program - BASC



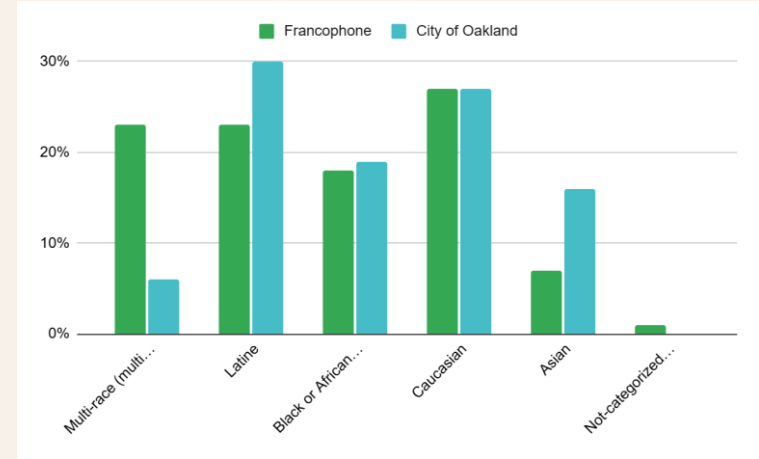

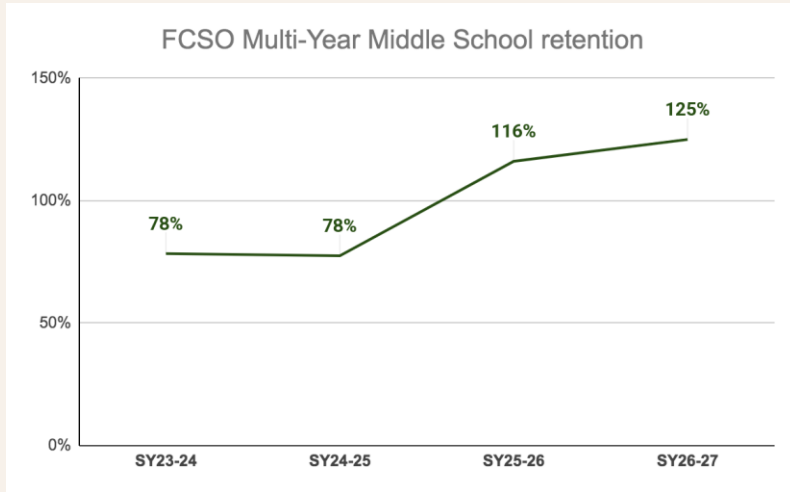

Financial and Operational Sustainability



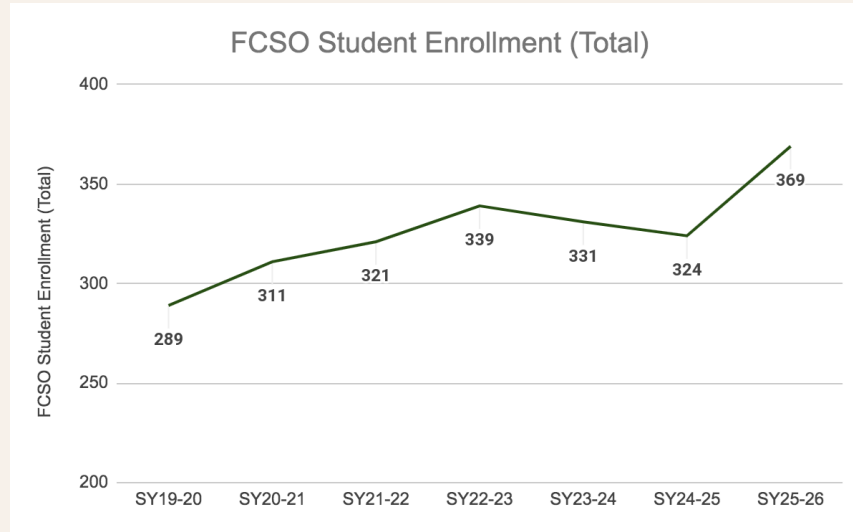
Our high student retention rate similarly reinforces that our families want to continue to grow with FCSO

Intent to Return commitments show that we can anticipate further retention from ES into MS, and throughout MS (proj: 125% for SY-26-27)

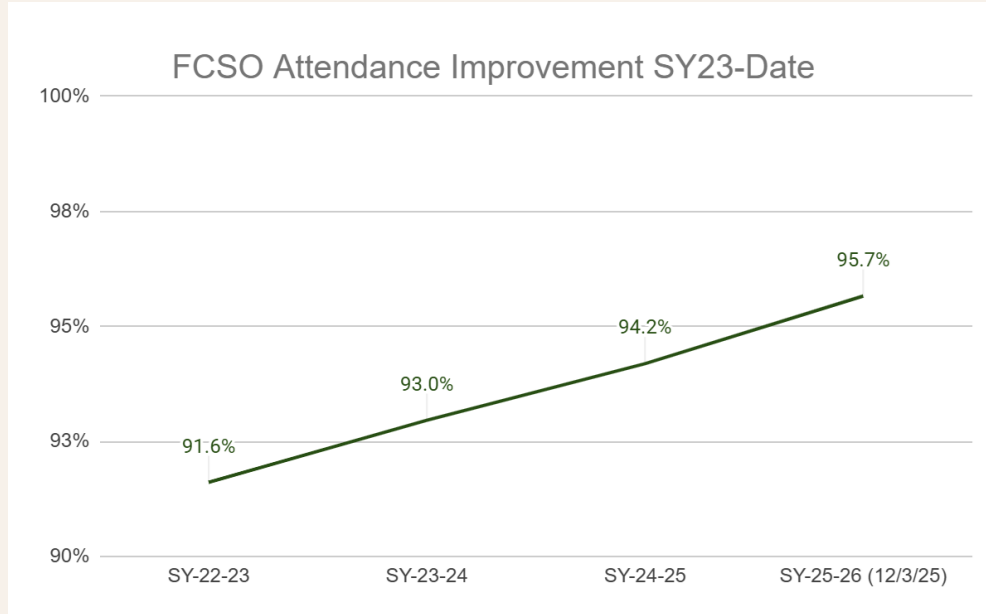
