Acceptance by the Board of Education of a California Partnership Academies (CPA) Program: Career Technical Education Initiative Grant Award from the California Department of Education, for the College Preparatory and Architecture Academy (0065) at Fremont High School, CDE Grant Number 2025-23181-61259-01, in the amount of \$81,000.00, contingent upon the availability of funds, for the period of July 1, 2025, to December 31, 2026, pursuant to the terms and conditions thereof, if any.

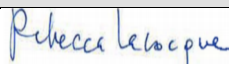

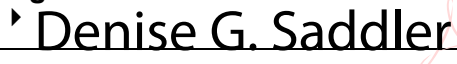

Grant Award Notification (Continued)

The following conditions apply:

1. The grant award will be processed upon receipt of the signed Grant Award Notification (AO-400). This AO-400 must be signed by the superintendent or an authorized official and **returned within 10 working days**.
2. All approved program funds must be expended within the dates designated and for the maximum amount indicated on the AO-400. Encumbrances may be made at any time after the beginning date of the grant stated on the AO-400.
3. The grantee is required to use these funds only for the operation and maintenance of the California Partnership Academy (CPA) at the high school noted in the AO-400 in accordance with the provisions of California *Education Code* sections 54690 through 54697. These funds may not supplant current fixed costs. Expenditures shall comply with all applicable provisions for federal, state, and local rules, regulations, and policies relating to the administration and accounting for public school funds. These funds are instructional in nature.
4. The grantee must limit administrative indirect costs to the rate approved by the CDE for the applicable fiscal year in which the funds are spent.

Upon receipt of the required certifications and an approved budget, scheduled payments of grant funds will be as follows:

- Fifty percent of the funds will be released upon completion and return of the AO-400. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
 - Final payment will be processed in November 2025. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
 - The End-of-Project (EOP) Expenditure Report is submitted on the Program Grant Management System (PGMS) platform. The EOP Expenditure Report is an itemized grant expenditure report with descriptions of all activities or purchases. All funds must be expended on or before the end of the grant period. Failure to submit an EOP Expenditure Report will result in a billing from the CDE for the entire amount of the funds paid. The EOP Expenditure Report is due on **February 2, 2027**.
5. At least three key staff members from each CPA are required to attend the **Educating for Careers Conference** to be held **March 1–3, 2026**, at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center in Sacramento. These funds can be used for that purpose.

If the grantee terminates its participation in the program, the grantee shall submit a final expenditure report within 30 days and return the unexpended funds upon receipt of a billing from the CDE. Supplies and equipment purchased with these funds will be redirected to other CPA sites.
