



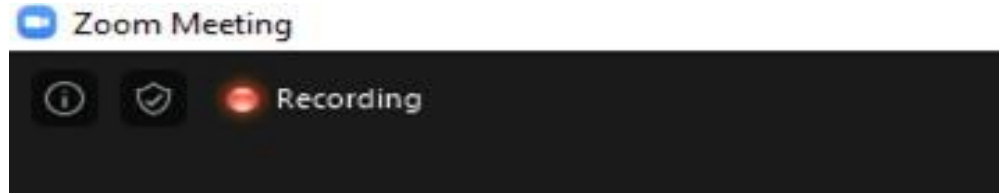

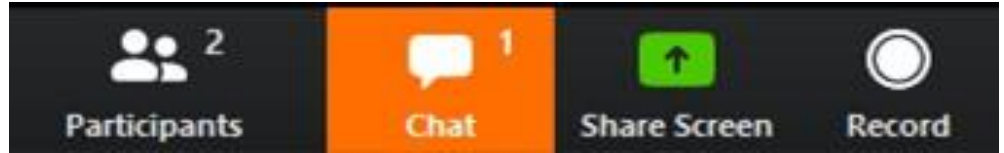

# Board Resolution [Link](#)

In June 2021, the OUSD School Board passed Resolution No. 2021-0159 - Ensuring Access to Social- Emotional and Academic Supports for Students with Disabilities. This resolution was introduced to the Board by the members of the CAC.

## **Excerpt from the Resolution's Memo: "**

As a full service community school district, OUSD has long recognized the importance of wrap-around services in students' academic and social-emotional growth. However, many students with disabilities have had challenges accessing these services because they need modifications and/or extra support to be able to participate in enrichment or social emotional programs outside the classroom . . ."

# Students with Disabilities Access Resolution Report

Priorities and Investments Summarized in the [Nov. 2021 Report](#):

- Increase school-to-home communication;
- Include strategies to support students with disabilities in the *School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)*;
- Require that all contracts for student services address how needs of learners with disabilities will be addressed;
- Continue professional development for afterschool staff and provide appropriate materials;
- Increase professional development days for OUSD educators to focus on UDL and disability awareness; and
- Build career pathways specific to students with disabilities through Linked Learning.

Staff from *After-School Programs* and *Athletics* will share what has happened since they last reported to the CAC in October 2023.

# Collaboration with Expanded Learning Office

# Ongoing Training, Support and Resources

- Supplemental Assistance Form for programs to submit if they feel that a student requires a level of support beyond “reasonable accommodations”
  - weekly meeting (SpEd, SPG, ExLO) to review forms, discuss and make recommendations
  - Additional Materials Catalog & Request form
- Bi-weekly, drop-in office hours until mid-November with Special Education for ASP staff to ask questions and check-in related to training
- Capacity-building for program staff by SPG (Speech Pathology Group): on-site coaching and consultation for staff, behavior tech support, monthly trainings on specific topics for program staff
- Supported ExLO (Expanded learning Office) to present to Region 4 Expanded Learning Conference - October 2023

# **Questions Asked by Participants in the October 2023 Meeting**

Would be useful to have a list of SCP after school participation by contracting vendor? That way when, say, a contractor wants to expand services, our district can make an informed decision based upon their track record providing access for all

*That is the plan next. Put the agencies that are running the programs that we can look that up as well.*

Laila Jenkins-Perez presenting :)

Shift from accommodations to inclusion.

Rubric was useful. Having the language was incredible and support from Special Education staff.

I am speaking about the assistance for the afterschool program, the slide showed only SDC classes..

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Do we have afterschool programs for the Young Adult Program?  
Not specifically at Santa Fe; we did open one at Burbank:

Beautiful goals! Given how understaffed SPED is, and how understaffed afterschool programs are, what is the plan for garnering trained support staff for extracurricular settings?

*Support through the Speech Pathology group and others to provide temporary support to build capacity. Helping the programs build capacity. Staffing not always what is needed; also about the way things are planned. We are looking at the sites that have more Mod-Ext population. What kind of programming could be done targeted to these populations? Additional support AND how the programs are designed from the get-go, especially across elementary sites so that we can more easily include students with more extensive needs.*

What has communication with transportation been like for ASP access? *Students are currently being picked up by parents. I haven't come across families stating that they could not attend because of the transportation piece. Have not come across that.*

Is this SpEd community engagement programming or inclusion within general resources provided by OUSD? Is Community Schools and Student Services supporting this work?

# October 2023 Report about Access to Athletics

# Collaboration with Oakland Athletics League

- Joint presentation with Special Olympics to Athletic directors in August 2023
- Creating partnership opportunities with BORP - Bay Area Outreach and Recreation Program
- Promoting events and tryouts to families through Parent Square
- Planning unified sports field day events at several schools -
  - Grass Valley, Fremont, Bret Harte, Skyline, Oakland Tech
- Creating opportunities for students and families to attend sporting events for free

# Data from OAL Eligibility Roster

- Added Special Education as a filter/status in the OAL Eligibility Roster - currently this is only at the High school level.
- 13% of the 751 total OAL student roster have special education status and are currently participating in Athletics at their sites. This number varies according to seasonal sports.
- School highlights:
  - Castlemont: 18 out of 98 students (18.3%)
  - Fremont: 15 out of 102 students (14.7%)
  - Madison Upper: 8 out of 46 students (17.3%)
  - McClymonds: 12 out of 78 students (15.3%)
  - Oakland High: 15 out of 125 students (12%)
  - Oakland Tech: 19 out of 182 students (10.4%)
  - Skyline: 8 out of 116 students (6.8%)

# Questions Asked by Participants in the October 2023 Meeting

If a teacher or coach would like support and didn't make it to any of the workshops and doesn't have any of this information, who can they contact to get support?

Do we have opportunities for Special Olympics at the elementary level?

Franky Navarro: allocated funding for additional coaching support. Additional position if there is participation from students with disabilities. We want to remove barriers. Need to identify more staff. Additional coaching stipends set aside to support the growth of this program.

Comment: I love the After School Program people. Our Speech Therapist was a coach at our school and she was replaced as coach. She was an amazing resource.

Do we have opportunities for Special Olympics at the elementary level?

*There are a lot of things that we can do that are already happening. example: we were planning events for unified sports focusing on interdependence. We will be able to call on Special Olympics but we want schools to be doing it, to own the idea of inclusive athletics. If there is something that Crocker wants to do we can partner with you to do it whether it is Special Olympics or not.*
