All City Council Student Union Vision

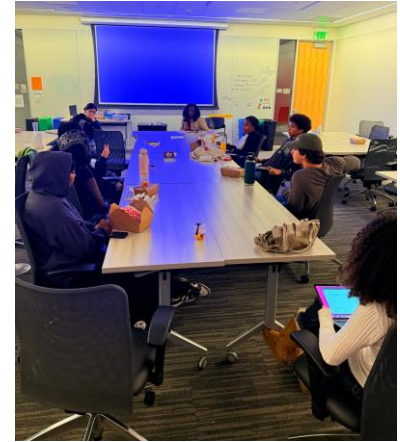
We Envision:

- Met with 11 OUSD departments over the year

ACC in Middle Schools 2024-25

4 General Middle School Meetings - 15 middle schools, 80 Students engaged

- Opportunities for student leaders to get to know other student leaders across OUSD

25-26 Priorities:

Career Exploration:

Young people in OUSD believe that their schools are doing well at preparing them for life after high school but would like to be exposed to more opportunities to explore their career and academic interests.

Inclusion:

We identified a lack of Special Education related representation in our student leadership spaces, and a general divide between students that are in general education and students who are in special education. In order to bridge that gap, we launched several different efforts at Skyline, and collaborated with the Disability Access team in central office.

Nutrition:

Our assessment has revealed significant concerns within our current school meal services, including age-inappropriate food portions, delayed scheduling, food waste, and meals that don't reflect our community's culture, all of which contribute to student hunger and missed classroom time. In response, we are proposing student surveys, a student-led task force, equitable portion sizes, local food sourcing, and dedicated funding to improve the overall meal experience. Through collaboration with the Nutrition Services Department, we hope to ensure that every student feels nourished, represented, and ready to learn.

State Seal of Civic Engagement

- ~92 students in OUSD obtaining the State Seal of Civic Engagement (SSCE).
- 83% increase in students receiving the seal this school year.
- Over 200 students applied this year vs. only 85 last year!





Core Leaders Committee

Coalition where youth members of organizations that support OYV including ACC help facilitate and plan outreach and curriculum

Highlights of What CLC Has Accomplished This Year

1. Finalized and presented the Evaluation Report
1. Developing youth vote strategies for the November 2026 election in partnership with the ROV, ACOE, and OUSD.
3. Media Committee training in media literacy and analytics.
4. Civic Engagement committee currently working on reviewing the curriculum

Health and Wellness update

Oakland Technical High School launched its first ever Wellness Center and Peer Wellness Ambassadors program.

- We have trained 12 Student leaders in topics like:
 - Mental Health First Aid
 - Crisis Response
 - Cycles of Abuse
 - Restorative justice
 - Addiction Response
- The wellness center/Peer Wellness Ambassadors have provided support to over 100 students weekly
 - One on one wellness counseling - referrals coming
 - through COST and Self Referral Forms
 - Weekly Affinity Restorative Justice circles
 - Tier 2 Restorative Justice Circles
 - Academic Tutoring



Suggestions for Future LCAP/Budget Engagements

LCAP Directors Recap:

- Attended about 9 PSAC meetings during 25-26 ACC Governing Board year!
- Presented about ACC engagements (Including High School Engagements + Middle School Engagements), data from engagements, and represented the student voices pertaining to budget related discussions
- Advocated for more accessible and student-friendly engagement spaces so a wider range of students could participate in LCAP discussions

Suggestions for Future LCAP/Budget Engagements

Next Steps Planned For Next Year:

- Future LCAP Directors will plan to conduct classroom visits with high school leadership to explain the LCAP, collect feedback, and invite students to PSAC.
 - **Teach students about the LCAP, LCFF, and district's budget**
 - **Collect student feedback to bring to PSAC**
 - **Invite more students to PSAC meetings**
- Advocate for greater transparency around the district budget.
- Expand outreach efforts to middle schools to encourage earlier student involvement in district advocacy and leadership spaces
