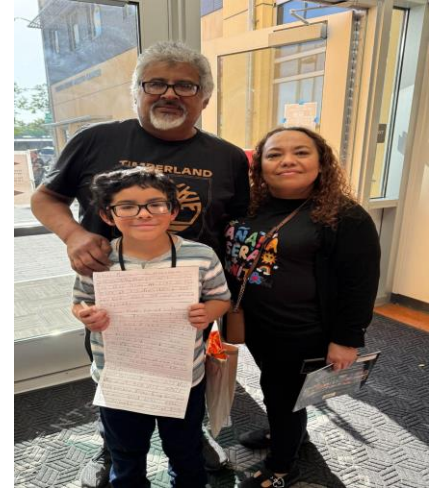

## VISION:

In Oakland, every student is a reader. We believe books are windows into other worlds, carrying students to places they have never been, introducing them to people they have never met, and reflecting back the stories and experiences that make them feel seen and known. When students have access to books that speak to them, spaces that welcome them, and adults who make reading feel like something worth doing, motivation follows. Habits form. Identity deepens.
