ILT VISION: West Oakland Middle School is deeply committed to creating a school that empowers students to be a positive force in their communities through an instructional program that is anti-racist, culturally relevant, and academically rigorous. With strategies, knowledge and tools, the ILT will help teachers create engaging learning experiences for students that enable them to think critically and become **independent** learners. ILT will help create the conditions necessary for teachers to strengthen students' literacy across all content areas.
