Overview of McClymonds High School

Student Enrollment of School-258

School Demographics

- 78% Black/African American
- 6.2% Hispanic/Latino/X
- 3.4% Middle Eastern
- 2.4% Other Pacific Islander
- >1% of the following: White, Filipino, Samoan, Asian Indian, Cambodian

Class of 2023 Statistics

- Average unweighted GPA: 2.76
- Average weighted GPA: 2.91
- Highest weighted 10-12 GPA: 4.56
- 60% plan to attend a 4-year university
- 40% plan to attend a 2 year college









School Characteristics

- McClymonds High School is a comprehensive, full service, community four year public high school, with an enrollment of 258 students in grades 9-12
- Founded in **1915**, McClymonds High School is the third oldest high school in Oakland and the only high school operated by the Oakland Unified School District in **West Oakland**
- McClymonds High School is the **last historical Black High School** in Oakland
- > Out of 42 staff members, 12 are Mack alumni









Measure N Funding Characteristic-How do we continue to build and sustain robust Pathways with funding based on enrollment?

- In 2018-19, McClymonds High School had \$400,600 in Measure Ν
 - 3 FTE 1.0 CTE teachers
 - **Career Exploration Visits**
 - Summer internships for 11th and 12th graders
 - **ECCCO** stipends for students
 - Transportation for WBL
 - Supplies for PBL projects
 - Peer Tutoring program stipends for students

- In 2023-24, McClymonds High School has \$217, 600 in Measure N
 - 1 1.0 FTE CTE Engineering Teacher
 - .65 FTE CTE Engineering **Teacher**
