### **Showcase Components:**

- Pathway Spotlights: Pathway leaders prepare to share 4-6-minute stories or highlights from their pathway. They will be grouped by industry sector and be able to connect and learn from colleagues across the district and city. These spotlight presentations are meant to be a "light lift" and should spotlight some bright spots from the past year or good or emerging practices.
- Pathway KIVA Panels: The Kiva, a protocol developed by the Center for Leadership and Educational Equity (CLEE), allows large numbers of people to fully participate in a discussion with representatives to voice opinions that are then discussed in smaller groups. These panels will be organized by topics identified by pathway staff. No preparation is required for this, just participant participation.
