- **Student Enrollment of School**

- Total Enrollment: 97
 - Female: 48.5%
 - Male: 51.5%

- **Highlights of Student Demographics**

- English Language Learners - 20.6% , Special Education - 19.6% , African American - 43% (focal population), Special Education - 19.6%, Homeless - 10.3%

- **Schoolwide Systems Supporting Pathway Quality Improvement**

- Continuation School - Credit recovery, Trimesters
- Small class sizes

Our Pathway - *Hospitality, Tourism, Recreation (HTR)*

Courses

- Introduction to Arts & Design in Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation
- Hospitality Marketing
- Food Science/Nutrition
- Senior Seminar
- Academic Core courses align with HTR sector standards

Programming

- Food and Garden Education curriculum with Grow Together
- College Tour - 3 community colleges outside of Oakland (Year 2 of college tour)

Key Findings

- Goals were centered around partnership development and staff development to enhance curriculum

 - Students will see employment opportunities aligned with their coursework
- *Develop Measure H Committee that includes teachers interested in HTR*
 - New teachers can share input on current Pathway practices

Personnel - School Counselor Position

- Our School Counselor builds and maintains meaningful relationships with our entire community to support their social, emotional and academic well-being resulting in more participation in Pathway Programming Overall.

Internships Stipends

- Our students consistently mention wanting hands on learning. Internships are a great way for our student to learn new skills while getting paid with the support of our staff

College & Career Exploration

- This year we will have visited 7 colleges (6 community colleges, 1 4-year college). Being a small school opportunities like this allow for one student to take multiple trips to gain more experience to make informed post-secondary choices. Excited to continue these efforts.
